Subject: Draining of the Congo Peat Bog

Proposed by: Switzerland, United States of America, United Kingdom, Ukraine, Brazil, Pakistan, United Arab Emirates, Norway

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

*Concerned* about the negative effects of drilling for oil in the Congo Peat Bog,

*Recognizing* the potential economic benefits of oil drilling in the Congo Peat Bog,

*Aware* that research is required for alternative energy sources for developing nations, especially those who have a financial reason to drill for oil,

*Having realized* the untapped potential of renewable energy sources in developing nations,

*Noting* with deep concern the struggles of underdeveloped nations to make environmentally cautious decisions due to financial deficits,

1. Pushes to create a trust fund to invest in research for clean energy in developing and at risk nations so they do not have to rely on environmentally damaging sources of energy;
2. Reminding nations that once developing nations and their populace receive this energy it will allow people to connect to the internet, allowing them to receive education and reduce the dependence on fossil fuels in the household.
3. Urges the United Nations to create a subcommittee dedicated to identifying nations who are developing and/or at risk for environmental damage so they may have money and research offered to them;

4. Calls upon the UNITED NATIONS to recognize countries who have a large history in the over-exploitation of resources in nations referred to in clause two and their susceptibility to dilemmas such as the peat bog;
5. Recommends opening the fund to all nations and private investors who wish to assist with the fund and environment;
6. Invites the United Nations to share insight gained from research regarding sustainable energy with all nations for the sake of global benefit.
